Individual Room Temperature Controls


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Thermostats in individual hotel rooms and offices are now a common sight. These thermostats allow occupants to control the temperature of the room or sometimes a group of rooms that are close together. However, in 1919, when an African American female inventor received a patent for a special kind of gas home-heating furnace, the idea of individually regulating room temperatures was new.

The heating furnace designed by this woman inventor included heating units arranged so that they branched out from a central furnace. Each heating unit was equipped with independent temperature controls. Hot-air ducts extended from these heating units to different rooms in the house.

As a result of this furnace's unique construction, the air in separate rooms could be heated to different temperatures depending upon the desires and needs of the occupants. When rooms were empty, the heating unit or units leading to those rooms could be set so that no heated air was released to them. This prevented the waste of energy and resulted in lower heating costs.
