5. All the rest of the days were sunny.

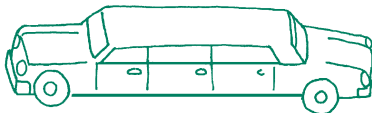
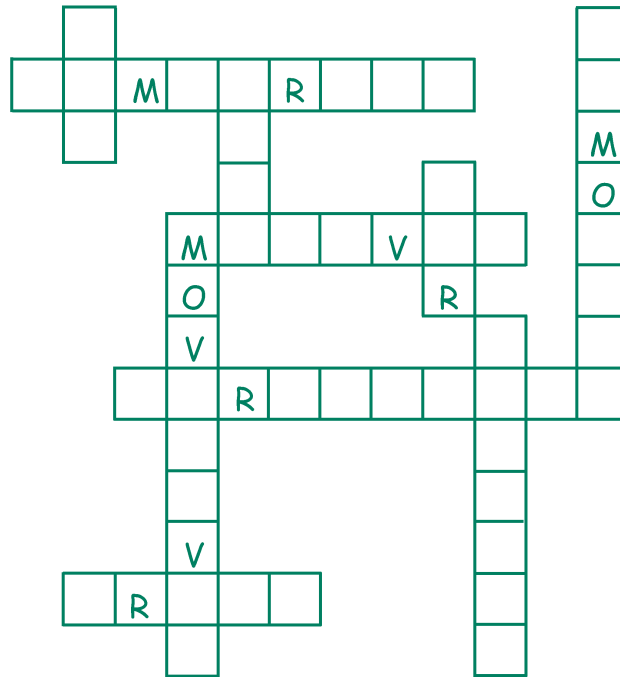

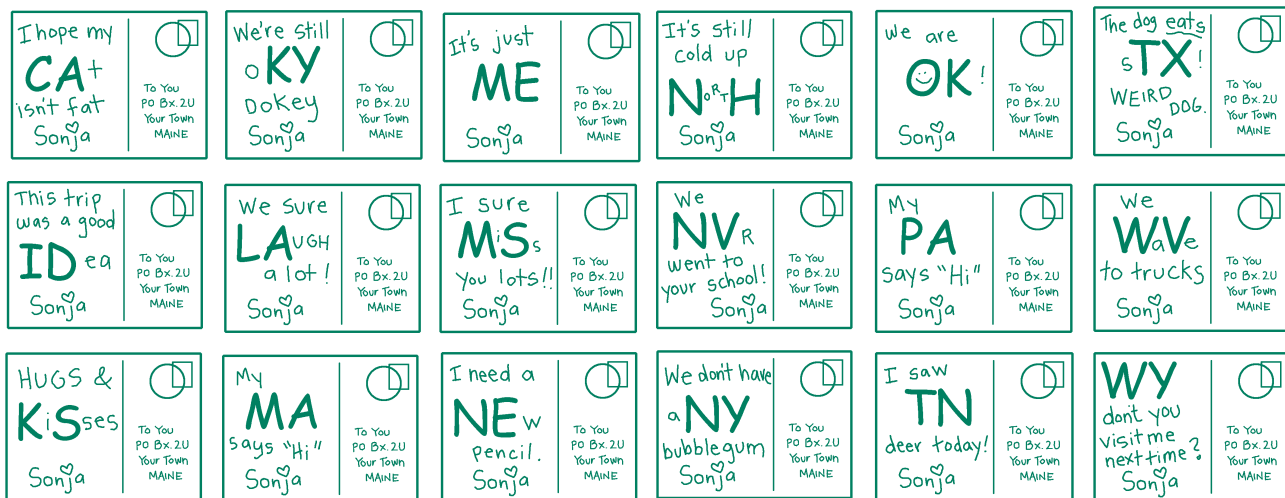
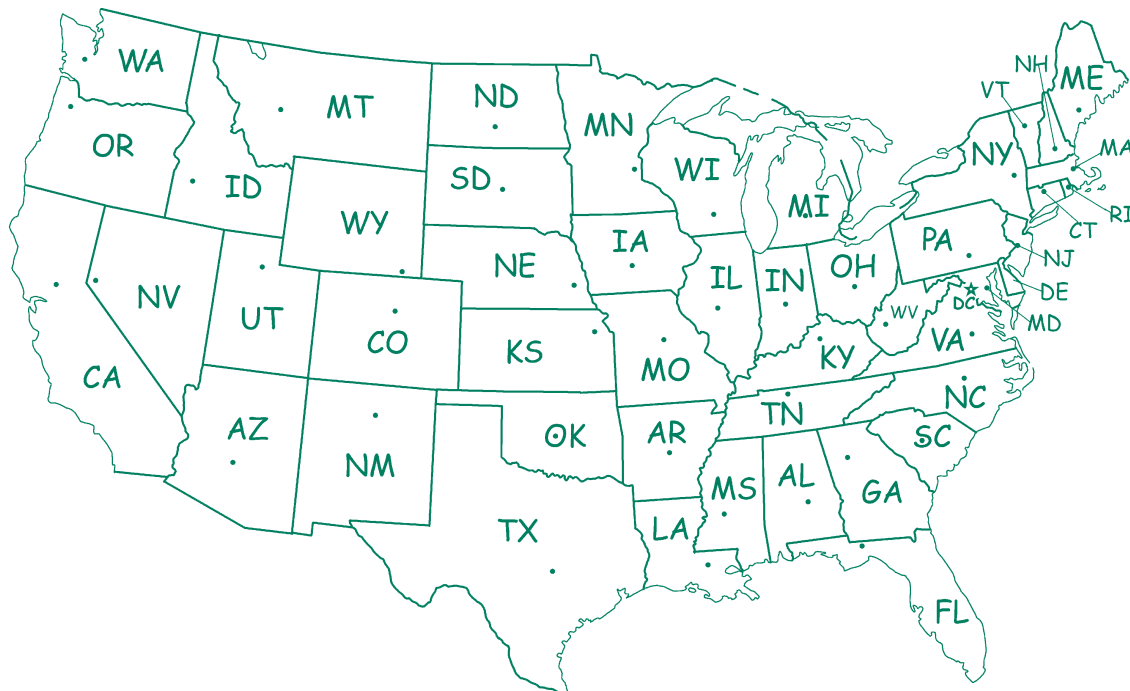
On the Road

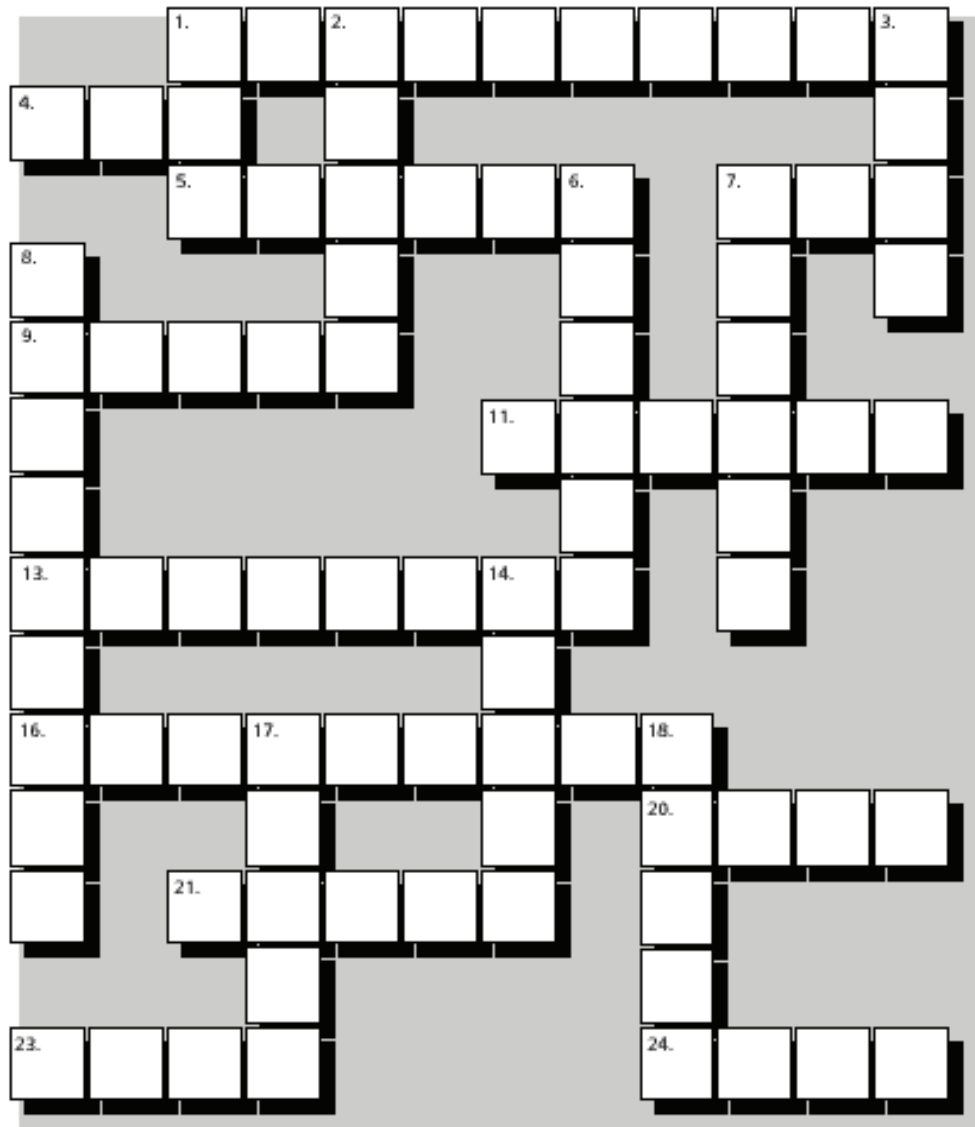

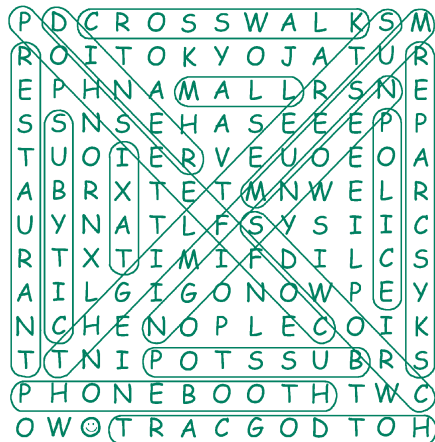
